High School Academic Awards System

Medallions will be awarded to students who demonstrate academic excellence. Students will become eligible for an academic award by earning points as a result of being on the Honor Roll or Distinguished Honor Roll each semester. Three (3) points will be awarded for being on the Honor Roll and six (6) points for being on the Distinguished Honor Roll. When a student has accumulated eight (8) points, a medallion will be earned. For each additional seven (7) points, an additional medallion will be awarded. During the senior year, a student who has earned at least two (2) medallions will be awarded a pewter plate on which the medallions may be displayed.

Athletic Awards System

Upon completion of the sports season, the coach shall present to the Athletic Director a list of athletes and managers eligible for major sport Varsity awards based on the following standards:

1. Football and Basketball: Participation in one-half the quarters.
2. Baseball and Softball: Participation in one-half the innings.
3. Cross Country: Compete as a top 7 runner in at least one-half of the meets.
4. Golf, Tennis, Volleyball & Wrestling: Participation in one-half the matches.
5. Field Hockey, Lacrosse and Soccer: Participation in one-half the games played.
6. Swimming & Track: Compete in at least half of the available events (6 meets, 24 possible events). If an athlete specializes in an event, they must be top 3 on the team in that event.
7. Cheerleading: Recommendation of the coach.
8. Coaches can recommend an athlete that does not meet the sport standards if the coach feels that they have earned it in other areas.

Anyone not receiving the Varsity award will be issued a certificate of participation. Awards shall be presented at the conclusion of the fall, winter and spring sport seasons during an appropriate assembly, whenever possible.

Types of Athletic Awards

1. Varsity - Award winners will receive a Varsity Letter and recognition pins. Two or more Varsity awards earned in the same sport through the senior year will receive a Shadow Box on which the Varsity Letter and recognition pins may be displayed.
2. Graduation Cord - Senior students that successfully complete 7 or more seasons of a high school sport.
3. Fackler Hower & E. Jerry Brooks - Awarded to seniors who meet the academic and sportsmanship requirements
4. Student Council Sportsmanship - Awarded to athletes that are nominated by coaches.
5. Jr. Varsity - Certificate
6. Junior High - Certificate

Forfeiture of Awards

Any member of a co-curricular activity who withdraws or is dismissed from the activity for an infraction of an established policy of the coach/advisor, school, or PIAA Bylaws automatically forfeits the right to receive any award or any other honor or privilege which he/she would have received as a member of that activity.
