The Instrumental Music Parent's Club was organized in July of 1956. Its purpose is "to arouse and maintain an enthusiastic interest in the various phases of instrumental music in the West York Area Schools". Membership is open to anyone interested in the progress and development of instrumental music in the West York Area Schools.

The officers and members of the club wish to thank the residents of the community for their continued support of the group's activities. Past projects have included the purchase of new uniforms, new instruments and miscellaneous band equipment; sponsorship of the John Philip Sousa Band Award; a \$200.00 music camp scholarship; partial payment of a summer band training encampment; preparation and serving of the annual band banquet; and help in transporting and chaperoning numerous band trips and social functions. Funds for current year's projects have been raised through the club's dance and card party, bake sale, Hootenanny, magazine sales and the annual Spring Concert souvenir program.

The main projects for the present year are to raise funds for new instruments to increase the versatility of the West York Area bands for a summer-camp scholarship for the second year, which has been designated the Albert Kelly Memorial Scholarship, and for a fifth annual band training encampment planned for late August 1964. A two-day concert tour is planned for April 24th and 25th of this year.

MISS NAN GULLO Pittsburgh Symphony

Nan Gullo, harpist with the Pittsburgh Symphony, was born in State College, Pennsylvania. She began her first music lessons on the piano at the age of six, but at thirteen became interested in the harp and traveled over two hundred miles each week to study with the nearest harp teacher.

Since then, Miss Gullo has studied and performed throughout Eastern United States and Europe winning scholarships and awards wherever she went. During high school, she was selected as an American Field Service Exchange Student to Germany. At Eastman School of Music, where she studied harp under Eileen Malone, she won a coveted George Eastman Scholarship for excellence in all fields of study. Also a scholarship student at the Julliard School of Music, she studied with Marcel Grandjany and won the Allan Wardwell Scholarship during her senior year. She was graduated with a B.S. Degree from Julliard in 1961.

While at Julliard she was solo harpist with the Julliard Orchestra, under the direction of Jean Morel, when it was sent by ANTA in 1958 to the Brussels World's Fair and other parts of Europe.

Her performing career has also included appearances at Carnegie Recital Hall, with the Queens Symphony, the Xavier Symphony, and other orchestras in the New York City area.

Miss Gullo achieved exceptional recognition during September, 1962 when she was invited to be harpist with the Julliard Orchestra for its appearance at Philharmonic Hall at the Lincoln Center during the Opening Week festivities.

This past December, she was selected by Concert Artists Guild for a debut concert at Town Hall, New York City. This summer she will be traveling with the Pittsburgh Symphony on concert tour to Europe and countries behind the Iron Curtain.

Alan Wyand, West York Area High School Band Director for the past five years, has been instrumental in promoting summer band camps, his book "Band Training Camps" is a complete account in this field, and his work with the percussion ensemble have both proven very successful.

Mr. Wyand, born in State College, Pennsylvania, received both his Baccalaureate and Masters Degrees from the Pennsylvania State University, where he was a member and officer of the famous Blue Band. In addition he led a dance band and toured nine European countries with the University Chapel Choir.

Performing on over 70 different percussion instruments and assisted by brass, wind ensemble, and full band; this unique group presents a varied program of ancient rudimental drumming, military music, mallet selections, light classics, and full contemporary ensembles by serious composers.

Past performances have included clinics and concerts for local music and service clubs, numerous high school assembly programs, county music associations, the Pennsylvania State University, Gettysburg College, and at the annual state convention of the PMEA. They have also appeared as guest soloists with the York Kiwanis Band, the Spring Garden Band of York, Channel 8 TV Lancaster, and with the Region III All-State Band of 1963.

During the summer of 1962, the ensemble completed a week's tour covering over 1000 miles with stops at Carnegie Tech, Indiana State College, Penn State University, West Chester State College, and Beaverbrook Music Camp.

The group has also sponsored two "Days of Percussion" featuring clinics and concerts with guest artist Dick Schory, Frank Arsenault, and Duane Thamm, all of Chicago.

The West York Area High School Dance Band, better known around York as the "Royalaires," has become one of the most active ensembles within the instrumental music program.

Having its origin in January, 1960, the band has not only played for many of its own school functions, but has also made numerous appearances at other schools, special dances, and service clubs throughout South-Central Pennsylvania. In addition to dance engagements, the "Royalaires" have also played special assembly programs where they trace the history of jazz with narration and music, appeared with local concerts, entertained at conventions, and provided music for several school plays.

This past Spring, R. C. A. Victor pressed a custom LP record as a souvenir album containing "favorites" from the band's repertoire. These recordings are still available to the public through the band office.

"OUR YEAR IN REVIEW"

The 1963-64 Senior Band year was launched at Camp Conrad Weiser by a week of preparation for the oncoming football season. Warm August days set a steaming pace for "out of shape" Seniors and "nervous" Freshmen as Mr. Wyand and his henchmen strove for perfection. Among this camps memories will be the steward's battle cry of "Waiters."

The opening football game set the stage for the band's new "eight to five" (eight steps to every five yards) entrance and crisp new routines, featuring new music, props, and even live actors. These routines included a satire on the "Playboy Club" (featuring the worlds longest chorus line) and an "Opening Night at the Doctor's" show; among which brought us many fine compliments.

In addition to performing at school games and pop rallies, the band traveled to Susquehanna University where we performed in the Homecoming Parade, at half-time ceremonies, and later returned to York to march in the annual Halloween Parade.

December was soon upon us and with it district band tryouts at Hershey High School. This year we set a new record with ten members successfully obtaining seats in District Band among over 1000 competing participants. Qualifying were Ron Anderson, Jay Barnhart, Dennis Brandt, Glenn Garver, Rickey Geesey, Gary Hamme, Rick Hoover, Charles Lecrone, Dave Rohrbaugh, and Mike Warner. Three, Dennis Brandt, Glenn Garver, and Rick Hoover, represented this group at Regional Band held at Coatesville. Participating in District Orchestra later this Spring will be Sue Anderson, Rickey Geesey, Gary Hamme, and Kathy Wecker. An outstanding accomplishment was that of Dennis Brandt playing in a special All-State Band held in Philadelphia in conjunction with the national convention of the Music Educators Association.

The band then celebrated the holiday season by performing five selections at the Annual Band and Choral Concert. Again there was Christmas caroling throughout the West York Area, climaxed with refreshments and fun at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Earl Fries.

Our renowned Percussion Ensemble presented its second annual "Day of Percussion" featuring Chicago recording artists Dick Schory and Duane Thamm. In the evening concert, two new numbers were premiered in this part of the country with the use of over 80 different percussion instruments assisted by the newly organized wind ensemble. Added to this concert performance, the ensemble has earlier performed at Gettysburg College and is now processing its own recording.

The beginning of the new year found the band preparing for the Annual Spring Concert. We were happy to learn that Miss Nan Gullo, harpist with the Pittsburgh Symphony was to be our guest soloist. Also, Mr. James Dunlop came from Penn State University to rehearse our band and render assistance in preparing for the big event on April 4. An innovation in this year's program will be the addition of a wind ensemble composed of a select group of 34 bandsmen.

The "Royalaires", our dance band, opened its activities by performing for the delegates of the All State Student Council Convention, and later for the Band Parents Club Dance and the Gettysburg Regional Antique Car Banquet. This group will sponsor its first annual Dance Band Jazz Concert in May and will later find area high schools as the setting for the coming months.

This year the band is proud to boast that over half its members participate in school sports. We also sponsor a bowling team, headed by Charles Lecrone, which has already won the first half championship in the AJBC Saturday morning bowling league.

Our executive committee whose function, besides carrying our regular designated duties, is to direct and administer band policy has also been quite busy. This group, with Mr. Wyand, has planned a dance to follow the band concert, band camp, and our present award system.

Outstanding musical accomplishments this year have also been gained by various instrumental ensembles. Among these are a brass sextet, a woodwind quintet, a German band, a string quartet, and a string choir; all of which were featured groups at a Sunday afternoon concert earlier this winter.

Our concert band is planning a two-day tour in April, when we will spend a night in Pottstown, Pennsylvania as guests of band students in that area. Other engagements planned include the West York Memorial Day Parade, a Shiloh outdoor concert, and Commencement activities.

The Band Parents Club is again sponsoring and preparing for the annual band banquet to be held on May 1st. All parents are invited to witness the presentation of awards to band members and our special entertainment.

This has been a busy and rewarding year; we wish to thank all who have supported us.



BAND EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Because of the increasing size and complexity of the senior band, a need was felt for more student control and committee work. Thus, in January, 1960, a system of student government was adopted.

Each officer has assigned duties and obligations which he must perform in order for the band to function smoothly. In addition, the executive committee meets at irregular intervals to discuss band policy, handle some discipline problems, plan social activities, and to work on student committees.

Major projects developed by the committee during the last three years include: the promotion of blue and white band jackets, the adoption of award pins and certificates, the founding of an intermural sports program within the band, the designing of band decals, and the planning of certain phases of the annual band training camps. 


