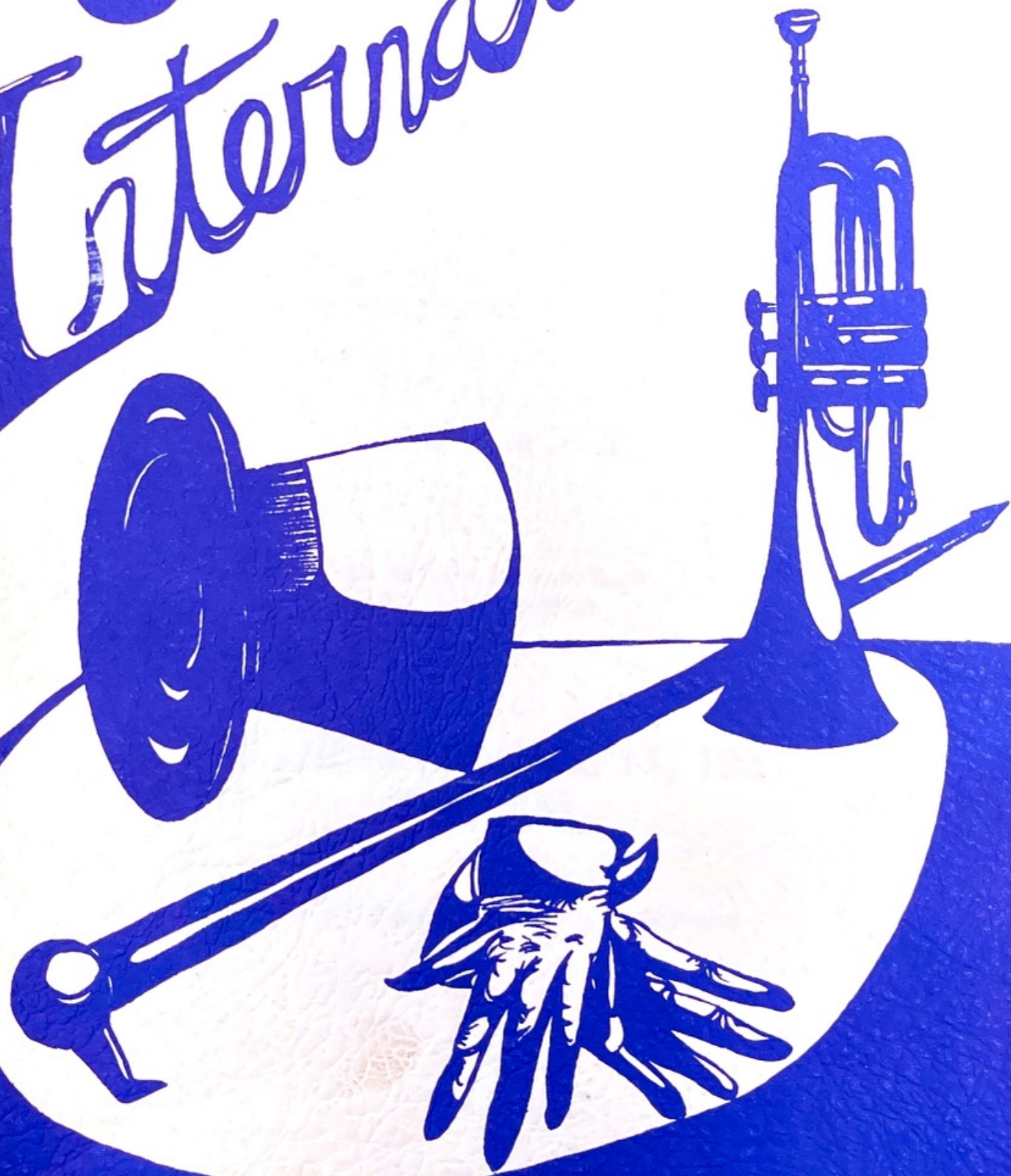

OUR FEATURED SOLOISTS

BETH RODGERS and SUZANNE SENFT

French Horn Soloists



Appearing in tonight's concert as featured student soloists are senior French Horn players Beth Rodgers and Sue Senft. Both girls have been active members of the band since beginning their instrumental training in the West York Area School District music program. In addition to participating in the Symphonic and Marching Bands both girls have been active in the ensemble program, having been members of the brass ensemble for two years. Beth has also been an active member of the woodwind quintet and serves the band as a section leader.

In competition, Beth has won positions in two PMEA district festivals. Most recently she represented West York in the District Band held at Hanover High School. Beth is also a member of the Modern Music Masters, a national music honor society.

ABOUT THE BAND

The West York Area High School Band begins each year with two weeks of intensive music and marching rehearsals. The first week for new members is "Rookie Week", followed by "Band Camp", which was held this year at Camp Nawakwa, Arendtsville, Pa. During the fall, the band performs at home and away football games and for numerous school and civic occasions. Often featured are the Majorettes, coached by Mrs. Wanda Reider, and the all-Male "Bulldog" Color Guard – a consistent winner in Competition – coached by Mr. Michael Donnelly.

The Symphonic Band is offered as an elective curricular subject meeting five periods per week for full credit. Of these periods, three are used for sectional rehearsal with student leaders in charge. In addition, many students participate in solo work and small ensembles, meeting after school and evenings. A series of student recitals is held to give these students an opportunity to perform and listen to each other. A professional recording is made by the Symphonic Band annually of their Spring Concert.

In addition to concerts presented in the York area, the band also makes an annual Spring Tour and has performed throughout Pennsylvania and many other states. Ensembles have performed at clinics and/or concerts at many Pennsylvania Colleges, at two PMEA state conventions, with an All State Band, on Television and for numerous civic and church organizations in the area. Highlighting the band's past activities are performances at Florida's Disneyworld (1974 and 1979), The President's Park at the "Ellipse" in Washington, D.C. (1976) and "Kings Dominion", Virginia (1980). This year the band will travel to Toronto, Canada to participate in the Toronto International Music Festival.

The band has twice been honored by the "First Chair of America" Yearbook and featured as "Band of the Month" by both the American School Band Directors Association and Phi Beta Mu National Bandmasters Fraternity.

OUR DIRECTOR

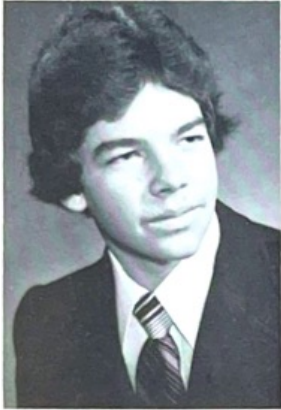

"OUR YEAR IN REVIEW"

For the band, football season began way before the first football game. "Rookie week", when all the "inexperienced" band members were learning their right foot from their left, was held from August 4th to 8th.



On Monday, August 11th, the band and band front piled on luxurious school buses and traveled to band camp. This year,



however, band camp was held at Camp Nawakwa, which was located in Arendtsville, Pennsylvania. Problems such as mosquito bites, band members passing out, and 90 degree temperatures were eliminated. Instead, the band was faced with the problems of rain, rain, rain and cool temperatures. No matter



what the problem though, everyone survived the rehearsals and managed to put together our first half-time show. On Wednesday, "Rookie Day", upperclassmen enjoyed giving the rookies a hard time and watching their expressions as they ate the delicious bulldog meat. As usual, the week ended with volleyball games and tug-of-war. The bandsmen once again won out



over the "Men of Jello", and the band girls defeated the Majorettes in the tug-of-war.

All the practice and hard work paid off in our first half-time show on August 30th against Dover.



This year's marching band season included the "Muppet Medley" featuring the percussion section, during which the band "flapped" and played on kazoos while Miss Piggy ran around the field. While the band played "Alexander's Ragtime Band", the

majorettes and guard danced before the home stands. Kimm Schrum, our first female drum major, did a good job giving everyone orders on the field.



On October 11th, the Mighty Band rode by bus to "King's Dominion", where we performed in a parade through the amusement park. The rest of the day was spent trying out the rides.



The Pot Luck supper in November showed the marching band season was over. After eating in the cafeteria, band members played volleyball, basketball or knee football in the gym. Renewed this year was the Band vs. Guard volleyball game with the loser doing fifty push-ups. Of course, as in the tug-of-war at camp, the band was victorious.

The "Bulldog" Color Guard and PAD were once again very active in parade competitions this fall. Highlighting the year was a trip to Philadelphia to perform in the Gimbels Thanksgiving Day Parade. We were all very proud of these members of our Band "Family" for their outstanding performance in this prestigious event.



This year's great marching season was possible only because of the hard work of many people. "Thanks" to the band staff, the band camp advisors, Mr. Donnelly, Mr. Eyster, Mrs. Reider and all the other people who helped put the marching band season together.

Symphonic band began the first week of school. Ensembles and other musical groups began rehearsing at the beginning of the school year. The brass ensemble, jazz band, clarinet choir, flute quartet, and woodwind quintet are examples of such ensembles. These ensembles all meet either after school or in the



evenings. Most of our ensembles have performed in our student recitals. This series of recitals sponsored by West York's Chapter of Tri-M, is held after school to provide an opportunity for band members and friends to perform and listen to solo and ensemble literature.

On November 16th, the Symphonic Band performed its first concert of the year. This was a "Pops" concert and in addition to the Symphonic Band, the Jazz Ensemble was featured. The concert, the earliest performance ever performed by our band, was a huge success and we are planning to make it an annual event.



The annual Christmas concert featuring the band, orchestra and chorus was held on December 21st. The Concert featured music of this festive season and sent everyone home with the spirit of the holiday.

Eleven band members were selected to District Band after try-outs at Cedar Crest High School on December 13th. These people were: Heather Chronister, Lisa Gilbert, Lisa Greiss, Bonnie Hamm, Melissa Heindel, Michelle Heindel, Jody King, Lynne Limbert, Beth Rodgers, Amy Sowers, and Dan Sowers. The District Band concert was held on January 23rd and 24th, at Hanover High School. One of these musicians, Amy Sowers, was selected to participate in Regional Band which was held March 5th to 7th at Northwestern Lehigh High School in New Tripoli, under the guest conductor Donald Hunsburger, from the Eastman School of Music. Heather Chronister represented the



band at the District Orchestra Festival in Gettysburg. Our "congratulations" to each of these talented musicians who represented us.



Our annual winter "Pops" concert was held on February 1st. As with our November concert, it too was an informal affair held in the cafeteria and it featured some of our ensembles and a patriotic sing-a-long. We also featured Drew Grove, Mark Wolf, and Craig Zearfoss playing "picket fences" in a mallet percussion trio.

Our school will also participate in a state band adjudication at Cedar Cliff High School on April 25th. At this event the band will be adjudicated against a standard by college and professional band directors.

The band has worked long and hard for this evening's performance. Tonight's featured band members include: Beth Rodgers and Sue Senft in a French Horn duet, and the Trombone section in "Escapade for Trombones". After the concert, the band will



see who the "Champion Hog" is at the banana split party, and go midnight bowling.

A recording of tonight's performance will be made at recording sessions on April 7th and April 22nd, by "Take Five" Frank Taylor.

On May 8th, the band will travel to Toronto, Canada to participate in the Toronto International Music Festival. Residents of



Toronto will house band members in their private homes. Tentative activities include an adjudication by professional musicians, three public performances, sightseeing, and a dance.

This year's band banquet will be held at the Dover Fire Hall on May 13th. At this time, seniors will be honored and awards will be presented.

Our trip to Canada would not be possible without all the fund raising projects held through the year. Sub sales were held in September and March. In October, the band sold Mrs. Smith's pies, a citrus fruit sale was held in December and pizzas were on sale in February. "Thanks" to everyone who supported these fund raisers.

The band will once again perform in the annual West York Memorial Day Parade and will end the year by playing at commencement exercises, during which time everyone will say goodbye to this year's great seniors.



At this time, we would like to "thank" everyone for the super symphonic band season. A special "thanks" to Mr. Eyster, the Instrumental Music Booster Club, the School Board and Administration, the band staff, and everyone who has supported our organization this year.

BAND STUDENT GOVERNMENT

Because of the increasing size and complexity of the total band program, a need was felt for more student control and committee work. Thus, in January 1960, a system of student government was adopted.

Each officer and staff member has assigned duties and obligations which he must perform in order for the band to function smoothly. In addition, the executive council meets at irregular intervals to discuss band policy, plan social activities and work on student committees.

Major projects developed by the council in the past include: the promotion of band jackets and shirts, the adoption of award pins and certificates, and the planning of annual cultural exchange trips and certain phases of the band training camps.

ENSEMBLES

Ensembles, an important part of the instrumental music program at West York, acquaint some of the more advanced band students to the techniques and literature of small group performance. During their after-school and evening rehearsals, stress is placed on balance, intonation, ensemble timbre, and sight-reading of literature from the various musical eras. Student leaders often conduct rehearsals themselves, thus gaining experience in rehearsal technique.

In addition to appearances within the school, the ensembles have performed in a solo/ensemble adjudication contest, on WSBA-TV, at banquets, and for numerous church and service organizations throughout the York area. They have also appeared in a series of student recitals sponsored by the West York Chapter of Modern Music Masters, a national music honor society.

Chapter 821 of the Modern Music Masters, a national music honor society, was formed at West York during the fall of 1965.

Modern Music Masters does for music what the National Honor Society does for Scholarship. With the current emphasis that is given to science, mathematics, and foreign language, Modern Music Masters helps to keep a proper balance between the academic and cultural subjects.

Chief aims of the society are to foster greater interest in band, choral, and orchestral performance, and to provide wider opportunities for personal musical expression. Students are selected for "Tri-M" membership on the basis of musicianship, scholarship, character, cooperation, leadership, and service to the school, church, and community. Prospective candidates must also perform a solo in concert or recital.

Although primarily an honor society, the West York Chapter has sponsored a series of student recitals and several field trips to hear concerts.

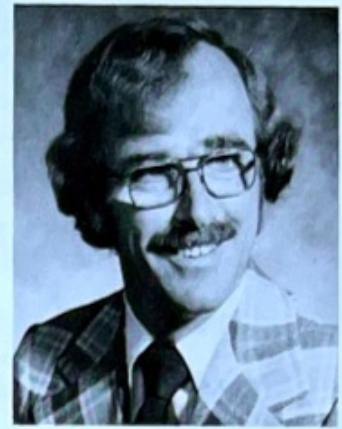
