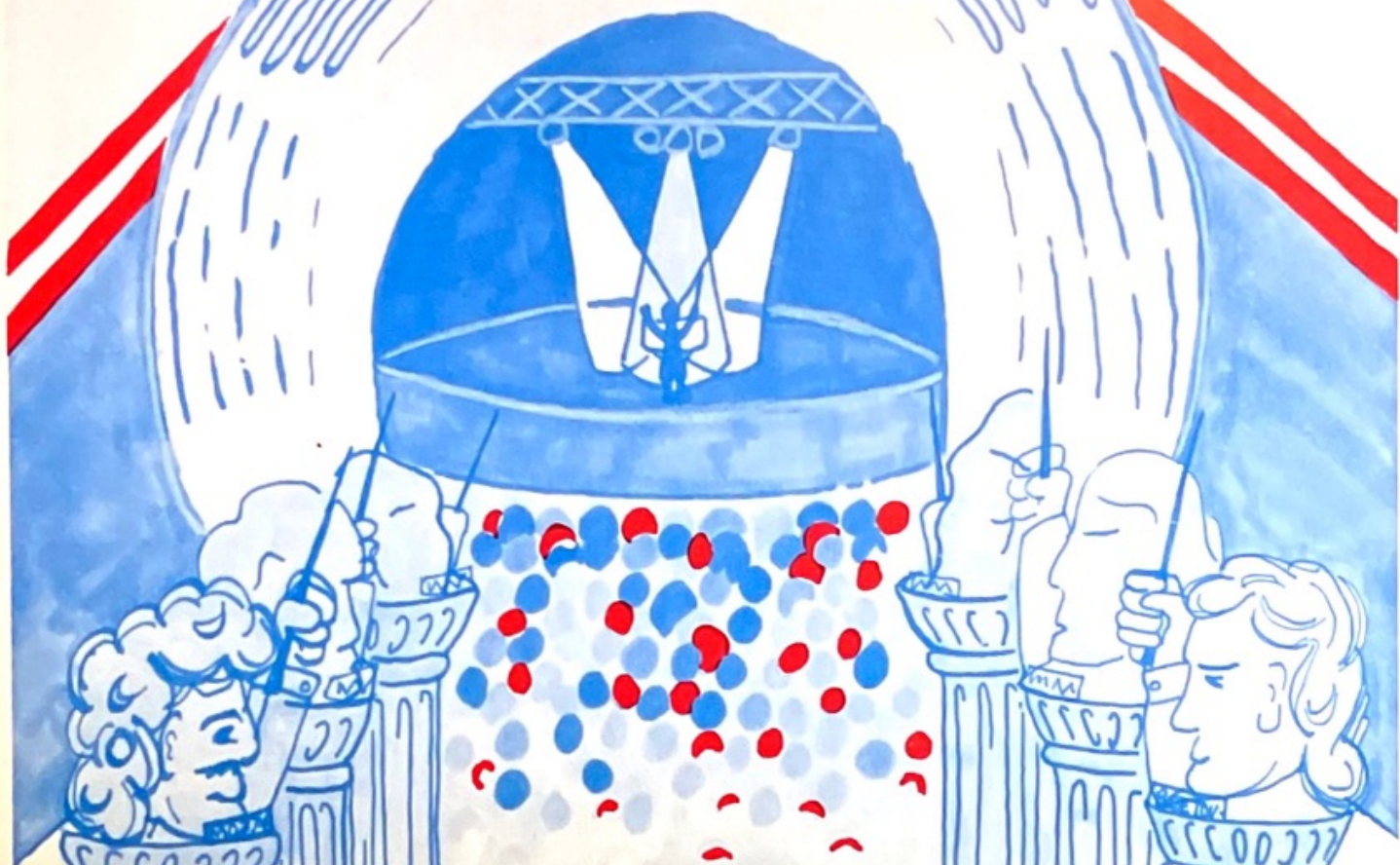

DAVID KLINE

Trumpet Soloist

David Kline, trumpet soloist for tonight's concert, has been active in the West York Area School District music program since beginning his instrumental training in the fourth grade. In addition to holding "first chair" in the Symphonic Band, Dave has been an active member of the Jazz Ensemble, Marching Band, Brass Ensemble and German Band. He currently serves the band as President and Section Leader and has also served the band as a manager. During his junior year, Dave was honored with membership in Tri-M Music Honor Society and was awarded the Band Personality Award. Dave has also represented the band in a PMEA District Band Festival.

Upon graduation this June, Dave plans to attend Indiana University of Pennsylvania with a major in elementary education.

ABOUT THE BAND

The West York Area High School Band begins each year with two weeks of intensive music and marching rehearsals. The first week for new members is "Rookie week", followed by "Band Camp", which was held this year at Camp Ramblewood, Darlington, Md. During the fall, the band performs at home and away football games and for numerous school and civic occasions. Often featured are the Majorettes, coached by Mrs. Wanda Reider, and the all-male "Bulldog" Color Guard - a consistent winner in competition - coached by Mr. Skip Rizzuto.

The Symphonic Band is offered as an elective curricular subject, meeting five periods per week for full credit. Of these periods, several are used for sectional rehearsal with student leaders in charge. In addition, many students participate in solo work and small ensembles, meeting after school and evenings. A series of student recitals is held to give these students an opportunity to perform and listen to each other.

In addition to concerts presented in the York area, the band also travels frequently and has performed throughout Pennsylvania and many other states and Canada. Ensembles have performed at clinics and/or concerts at many Pennsylvania colleges, the PMEA State Convention, on television, the State Capitol in Harrisburg, and for numerous civic and church organizations in the area. Highlighting the band's past activities are performances in Mexico City (1972), Disneyworld (1974 & 1979), Nashville, Tennessee (1983), Toronto, Canada (1981 & 1990), Boston, Massachusetts (1984 & 1988). The band has also performed at the Mid-East Band Clinic in Pittsburgh, the Eastern Band Conductors Conference and has twice been selected to perform for the Pennsylvania Music Educators Association State Conference (1982 & 1989). In the spring of 1992 the band travelled to Bermuda to participate in the International Music Festival "Bermuda Music Festival".

OUR DIRECTOR

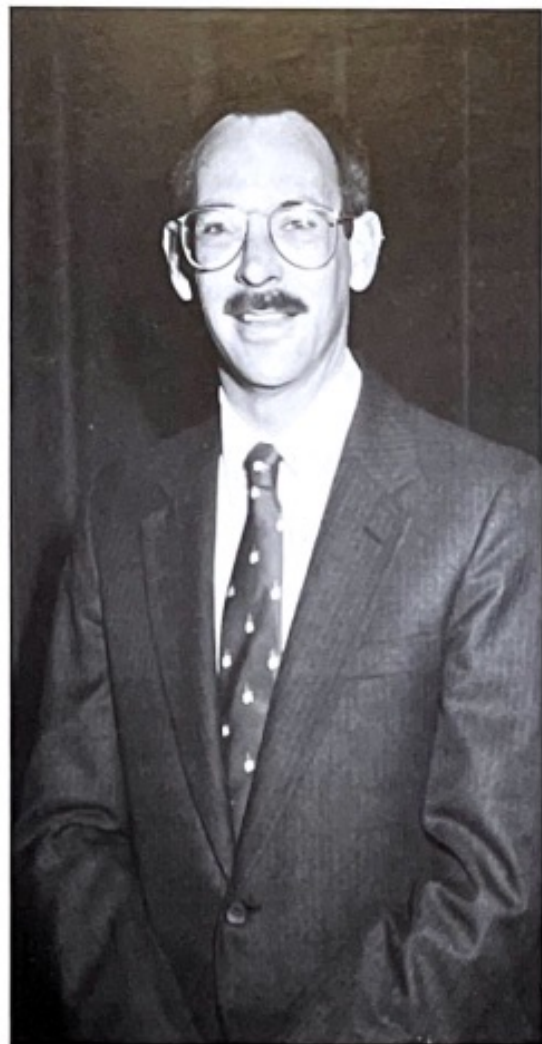
Thomas Eyster, Director of Instrumental Music at West York Area High School and Music Department Chairman for the West York Area School District, is a graduate of West York Area High School. After graduation from high school, he attended Susquehanna University, where he received his B.M. degree in Music Education. In college he toured with both the University Symphonic Band and the Jazz and Brass Ensembles in Europe and Mexico. He has done graduate study at Peabody Conservatory of Music, Duquesne University and Loyola College of Maryland. He taught in the Upper Darby School District, Delaware County (Pa.) before coming "home" to West York in 1977.

In addition to his duties at West York, Mr. Eyster has also served as an adjudicator and clinician in Pennsylvania and Maryland. In 1989, he was awarded a "Citation of Excellence" by the National Band Association for outstanding contributions to concert bands and band music.

Mr. Eyster is a member of the P.S.E.A. and N.E.A., the National Band Association, Pennsylvania Music Educators Association, the Music Educators National Conference, and the National School Orchestra Association.

Other societies to his credit include life memberships to Phi Mu Alpha, professional music fraternity and Phi Sigma Kappa, national social fraternity.

During the summer of 1985 and 1992, Mr. Eyster was a staff member of the Pennsylvania Ambassadors of Music for a European concert tour.

TRI-M MUSIC HONOR SOCIETY

Chapter 821 of the Modern Music Masters, a national music honor society, was formed at West York during the fall of 1965.

Modern Music Masters does for music what the National Honor Society does for Scholarship. With the current emphasis that is given to science, mathematics, and foreign language, Modern Music Masters helps to keep a proper balance between the academic and cultural subjects.

Chief aims of the society are to foster greater interest in band, choral and orchestral performance, and to provide wider opportunities for personal musical expression. Students are selected for "Tri-M" membership on the basis of musicianship, scholarship, character, cooperation, leadership, and service to the school, church, and community. Prospective candidates must also perform a solo in concert or recital.

Although primarily an honor society, the West York Chapter has sponsored a series of student recitals and several field trips to hear concerts.

Both District band and orchestra were held in January.

The symphonic band presented another Pops Concert in February, and this time was joined by the junior high band. Also in February was regional band, followed closely by regional orchestra in March. The Jazz band had several performances in April, including performances at the Junior High and the William Penn Jazz Festival, and a performance at the Spring Grove festival in May.

"Masters in the Hall" is the climax of the 1992-1993 school year for the Symphonic band and the culmination of months of practice. The band program will feature an eclectic assortment of the "masters", the great composers

of symphonic band music. The featured soloist for this evening is David Kline, playing the trumpet piece "Sounds from the Hudson" and accompanied by the band. This concert will be taped for Channel 23, YCAT for your repeated viewing pleasure.

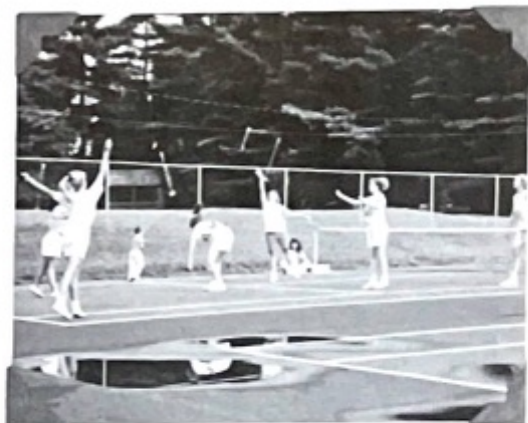

ENSEMBLES
