

STUDENT ENROLLMENT 2020-21

- 729 HS students were enrolled in Honors Courses.
- 108 HS students were enrolled in AP Courses.
- 15 HS student were enrolled in College in HS Courses.
- 24.5% of MS students were on Honor Roll.
- 37.3% of HS students were on Honor Roll.
- 19 seniors were honorees as Superintendent's Summa Cum Laude recipients (GPA 98% for HS career).
- 33 students experienced homelessness.
- 497 students received special education support services.
- 121 students received gifted support services.
- 17 different languages were represented across our student population as the primary language spoken in the home.









STUDENT ENROLLMENT 2020-21

(Number of Students Active/Monitored*)







CAREER & COLLEGE READINESS 2020-21

Career and College Readiness is a K-12 initiative where students are exposed to a variety of careers and skills at all levels to prepare students for future success.

Note: Due to COVID-19 closures and cancellations, several programs, such as the annual West York Job Fair, were canceled.

- York County Alliance for Learning (YCAL) Career Exploration Program Fifteen students participated in the YCAL Career Exploration Programs and some students participated in multiple programs.
- Apprenticeship Programs The goal for each program is hands-on experience in various trade fields. One student completed the Kinsley's Pre-Apprenticeship program and was hired upon graduation. Four students completed the Electrician Pre-Apprenticeship program.
- Harrisburg Area Community College (HAAC) Academy Fifteen students attended the HACC Academy in Auto Tech and Welding.
- Penn State Educational Opportunity Center PSEOC, a federal program dedicated to aiding individuals in furthering their education, sent a counselor regularly throughout the school year to meet with five seniors who qualified for this program.
- D.O. Work Experience Seven students participated in the work experience program.
- Junior Achievement Approximately 185 Trimmer Elementary students participated n JA BizTown. JA BizTown combines in-class learning with a day-long visit to a simulated town. This popular program allows elementary school students to operate banks, manage restaurants, write checks, and vote for mayor. The program helps students connect the dots between what they learn in school and the real world.







DISTRICT ACHIEVEMENTS 2020-21

- Scholarships 28 of our 180 graduates received scholarships, including several from the West York Foundation totaling \$54,200.
- **Sixty-six percent** of graduating seniors went on to 2- or 4-year colleges, not including ten students that entered the military upon graduation.
- Nineteen Seniors were honored as Superintendent's Summa Cum Laude recipients having maintained a GPA of 98 or higher for their high school career.
- Model UN Due to COVID-19 restrictions, Model UN conferences were canceled. However, the Club did a virtual field trip/tour and heard a guest speaker with the actual United Nations. They also participated in a virtual conference with Hershey and facilitated a mini-MUN with 8th-grade seminar students.
- The Middle School was recognized as a 2020-21 Project Lead The Way (PLTW) Distinguished School! Project Lead The Way provides transformative learning experiences for PreK-12 students and teachers across the U.S. PLTW creates an engaging, hands-on classroom environment and empower students to develop in-demand knowledge and skills they need to thrive. PLTW also provides teachers with the training, resources, and support they need to engage students in real-world learning.


FACULTY & STAFF 2020-21

STUDENT WELLNESS 2020-21

- The WY Flu Shot Clinic administered 334 flu shots in the Fall of 2020.
- Mental/Emotional Support initiatives:
 - Student Assistance Program (SAP) at the Elementary and Secondary school buildings
 - School counselors offered group and individual counseling
 - K-Pets at Lincolnway and Wallace
 - Safe2Say Something
- Take home lunches were provided to students on early dismissals if requested.
- The Bulldog Pantry, a non-perishable food center located in the High School, is open to all District families, kindergarten through 12th-grade. The WYASD served approximately 61 families each time the Pantry was open.
- Bev's Blessings Food Distribution:
 One hundred twelve Wallace/Lincolnway families on our
 free/reduced lunch list received a backpack of food each
 Friday for the children to have additional food for the weekend.
